Public Toilets

Since April 2016 Totland Parish Council have maintained the public toilets at Totland Bay and Colwell Bay. Both these blocks are old, however, the buildings themselves remain in good condition. The Colwell Bay toilets are used by over 50,000 people every year from local people to holiday makers with Totland Bay reaching around half this. After the summer of 2022 Parish Councillors have agreed to update the Colwell block and changing them into individual cubicles. Drawings to redevelop this site are in hand and they will include an accessible cubicle along with three unisex cubicles one with a baby changing facility.

The Parish Council will be carrying out these works by using a Public Work Loan and Councillors would like to assure Totland residents that this will not cost them by increasing the precept. There will be a charge to use these toilets of 20p. Many Town & Parish Councils have carried out this upgrade to their toilet blocks, and charging to use these facilities have been met favourably. We understand not everyone will be happy with this decision, but these toilets cannot continue to operate efficiently without this refurbishment. The Parish Council do not want these toilets to close as they are too valuable to our community but they must remain working and safe.

In addition to this, residents have been asking for toilets to be added onto the Recreation Ground for some time. Councillors agreed with this and now the Rec is used a lot more toilets would be idea. The Parish Council applied for a match funding grant for a changing places facility, and we are pleased to confirm this has been successful. The money will pay for the equipment and installation and the Parish Council will again obtain a Public Work Loan to build the shell for this. At this time another toilet cubicle will be installed and a charge to use these facilities will be made and no precept increase will be put on to residents.
