- 5. Colwell Common Container.
  The Planning Department had contacted the Clerk regarding the container on the Common as a resident had contacted them. They have asked various questions such as what the container stores and why. The Clerk confirmed this stored fencing, road pins,

tables and chairs all items required for events held on the Common. Councillor Howe is speaking with planning and it is hoped this will be dealt with quickly. Planning had informed the Parish Council no planning permission would be required, and the Clerk was disappointed with the lack of support from planning, we await further confirmation. The plants have started growing and bush and expect good coverage of this area by next year. The Clerk will look at colour matching to repaint the side of the container and also look at removing the information on the doors.

## **121/19 REPORTS**

1. Ward Councillor John Howe

Summers Lane remains a priority to me and I have met with Island Roads representatives twice since the last meeting. Water samples are being tested by Island Roads and once the results are back further action will be followed. Until results have been confirmed Summers Lane will not be resurfaced. Alum Bay New Road Development – Developers are now complaining as the surface water is running on to their site. They have asked Island Roads to put in gullies, however, it is expected they will not agree to this the developers are financial responsible for all works.

School Consultation – An option has been publicised and a new consultation will commence shortly. The option is to close All Saints on 31<sup>st</sup> December 2019 and move all children to Yarmouth. There will be a free bus to collect All Saints children, route not confirmed yet. All Saints will be demolished with a new school built and ready to reopen 2021.

## 2. Open Spaces -

The Clerk has been in contact with a lady who has been on the waiting list for a new Memorial bench for several years. She would like to purchase a bench for the new path on Stokes Green and Councillors agreed to this request. The Clerk would look into the options for seating and come back to them.

HALC will be launching its Fullers Village of the Year with various categories and the Clerk would like to enter this. Councillors agreed with this.

Councillor Ian Ward will attend the June meeting to discuss the Car Park on The Broadway and on Street Parking.

Badgers on Turf Walk. The Badger Group have looked at this area and have a couple of ideas. Clerk to arrange a meeting with a few Councillors to attend as well.
