#### 219/21 REPORTS

1. Isle of Wight Councillor Totland & Colwell - Councillor Chris Jarman. Feb-Mar 2022

Ward Surgery continues each Thursday morning 09:00 including the excellent opportunity to catch up with Helen on local activity. Most issues however are submitted to me by email or phone.

Significant complaints regarding roadworks and disruption caused including blocking of driveways to homes and pavements. There has been much discussion of this with the portfolio holder dealing with transport and through him with the contractor under Wightfibre and Island Roads. The work is a statutory right of Wightfibre as a utility but the IWC as highways authority monitors quality. Wightfibre have been placed under a remediation scheme due to poor quality of works.

There remains an ongoing concern regarding maintenance of homes through the housing association and complaints average about 3 per week.

Residents continue to ask regarding when their roads will be resurfaced. This major works phase of the contract is complete and the road resurfacing machines have been removed from the Island to their next project which I am told is in Surrey. The remaining many years of the contract is the maintenance phase (potholes etc) only.

I have written to Island Roads and to the responsible cabinet member regarding issues with their fixmystreet application and the recording of road and pavement issues. Several resident complaints arrived showing that reported problems were being deleted. I reported two problems myself and within minutes they were noted, pending and then deleted - confirming what had been reported to me.

I attended the open day at Green Meadows to where various Totland residents have relocated. All appear to be settling in well and thoroughly enjoying the location, facilities and in particular the company. All of the rentable units are in occupation and a couple of the part-buy ones remain available.

#### 2. Open Spaces

Tree works are required along Cliff Road due to road works and buses will need to pass. As part of the ongoing project for works on Stokes Green, a quotation has been received for this works at a cost of £1890.00. Councillors accepted this. This will be funded by a grant as previously agreed.

Turvills Field works which comprise of restoration and clearance would be £700.00. The Clerk informed the committee that the residents in this area want to be involved with Turvills Field and future plans.

Residents are setting up a committee as they are interested in being part of decisions and helping plant or clear on Turvills.

The agreed Hazels have also now been planted in Turvills and trees replaced on Colwell Common

Designs for two new benches with Totland Parish Council logo embedded were circulated and Councillors agreed to go ahead with these. The Clerk informed all that there was a 16 week wait time and delivery would be June/July. These would be placed close to the bus stop on Colwell Common and we would move the current wooden bench to Cokes Green to replace.

A request has also been received by a lady who would like to have a tree in memorial either with a sea view or Turvills Field, she would like a marker by this. The committee would consider this further.

#### 3. Clerk

To agree payment to Action Community Post Office up to the £5,000 by the end of March.

A younger member of the community has asked about adding to the outdoor gym equipment with pull up bars and parallel dip bars. Councillors are happy for the Clerk to investigate further and bring back to full Council a quotation and plan.

Defibrillator training was well attended on Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> March and over 30 people attended these sessions.

IOW challenge is taking place 30<sup>th</sup> April – 1<sup>st</sup> May, this goes through Totland but does not cross any land owned by the Parish Council.

Councillors agreed to purchase two Ukraine flags at a cost of £38.00 and GW would arrange for them to be raised at Totland and Colwell.

#### 4. Memorial Hall

Repointing works have been completed and a final quotation to carry out the remainder works is being sourced. There will be an increase in hiring charges as they have not changed since 2014.

#### 5. Events Committee

Spring Fun – Recreation Ground – Sunday  $1^{\rm st}$  May  $1{\rm pm}$  –  $4{\rm pm}$  All users and external people have been invited and the afternoon will showcase Totland.

Cakes, tea and coffee will be supplied and served by the Bowling Club and with the Men in Sheds we will offer defibrillator training for the youth.

Summer Camp – families only – Parish Council will supply tents if necessary. This will be on Weston Field and we hope to show a film and have a couple of small BBQ's to allow people to cook.

Autumn Wildlife Watch in Turvills Field and One Horse Field is planned for this season.

Winter will be the Totland Christmas Fair on Colwell Common.

Car Boots will continue every Saturday from May until September. This will be supporting West Wight Men in Sheds, West Wight Nursery, 1<sup>st</sup> Freshwater/Totland Scouts Group and FYTBus.

#### 220/21 BEACH BUOYS

To receive an update for the 2022 season.

A quotation has been received to increase the swim area at Widdick Chine out by a further 50m and add more buoys to completely enclose this area.

Cost Materials £1257.78 and labour £245.00.

Councillors agreed with this quotation and felt this would make Widdick Chine a much safer swim area.

Proposed Councillor Wyre, seconded Councillor Fennell all agreed. **RESOLVED**.

Councillors also asked if the launching lane in Colwell could be narrower to stop boats parking in between. The Clerk would also ask The Hut to remind their customers not to tether to these buoys or leave their boats in this area.
